

OUR LADY OF CANDLEMASS The shrine of Our Lady of the Taper at Cardigan in Wales, is dedicated to the Mother of God holding a candle to guide us to her Son. As such, the gospel for this proper mass is the Gospel of the Presentation of Our Saviour in the Temple, because of the Song of Simeon. Another name for the 2nd of February is the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Mosaic Law required that after childbirth, a new mother had to offer a purification sacrifice, whilst the new father had to offer a different sacrifice in thanksgiving for the birth of a son [Jesus]. Our Lady was immaculate and childbirth does not make anyone unclean, yet in obedience Mary does as she is told, and so does St Joseph. The Churching of Women today is better described as **Thanksgiving after the Birth of a Child.**



Our Lady and St Joseph have always been seen as models of prayer and service to God. Simeon the priest and the widow Anna are also important. They are in the Temple, looking for Jesus and devoting their lives to God. Accordingly, the Presentation of the Lord is the World Day of Prayer for the Consecrated Life. We are to pray for those men and women who become professed religious, monks, nuns, friars, sisters, brothers. Many of these orders and congregations take the name of Mary or Joseph in their titles
