

<u>CHANGES TO OFFERTORY PAYMENTS BY STANDING ORDER</u> Offertory donations are essential to help meet the costs of running our Parishes, whether that be heating bills, maintenance of the buildings or paying our Priest. One of the easiest ways to donate without having to remember to bring anything with you on Sundays is to set up a Standing Order. If you can Gift Aid the donation that is even better, as the Government will then add 25% to this out of the tax that you pay. You can also Gift Aid donations at any time even if you do not use Standing Orders. Donations to the Hall Fund can also be Gift Aided. Gift Aid forms, Standing Order forms and Ad Hoc envelopes are all available at the back of the Church. Most of those of you who are already donating by Standing Order do so direct to the Diocese and they then pass the money on to us. This will be changing in the next few weeks, and you will receive a letter asking you to change your Standing Order instruction so that the money comes directly to the Parish. THE TRANSFIGURATION The Transfiguration of Jesus is an actual event described in the New Testament, where Jesus is transfigured and becomes radiant in glory. Matthew, Mark and Luke (Matthew 17:1-8, Mark 9:2-13, Luke 9:28-36) recount the occasion, and the the Second Epistle of St Peter also refers to it. In the gospel accounts, Jesus and three of his apostles, Peter, James and John, go to a mountain to pray. On the mountaintop, Jesus begins to shine with bright rays of light. Then the Old Testament figures Moses and Elijah appear, and he speaks with them. Both figures were associated with the end of all things: they symbolize the Law and the prophets, respectively. Jesus is then called "Son" by the voice of God the Father, as in the Baptism of Jesus. Many Christian traditions, including the Orthodox, Catholic, Lutheran and Anglican churches, celebrate the event in the Feast of the Transfiguration, a major festival. The Transfiguration is one of the miracles of

Jesus in the Gospels. St. Thomas Aquinas considers the transfiguration "the greatest miracle", in that it complemented baptism and showed the perfection of life in Heaven. The Transfiguration is one of the five major milestones in the gospel narrative of the life of Jesus, the others being baptism, crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension. In 2002, Pope St. John Paul II introduced the Luminous Mysteries in the rosary, which include the Transfiguration. It is a pivotal moment, and the setting on the mountain is presented as the point where human nature meets God: the meeting place of the temporal and the eternal, with Jesus as the connecting point, acting as the bridge between heaven and earth. Moreover, Christians consider this scene fulfils an Old Testament messianic prophecy that Elijah would return again after his ascension (Malachi 4:5–6).
