





ORDINARY TIME Ordinary Time is what the modern calendar calls the green Sundays after Epiphany and the Green Sundays after Trinity. The Church does not intend that we should think these 34 weeks to be boring and ordinary in the usual sense of the word. The word "Ordinary" here is directly related to Ordinal and Cardinal numbers. Cardinal numbers have nothing to do with members of the Sacred College of Cardinals. Cardinal numbers are One, Two, Three. Ordinal numbers are First, Second, Third. These Green Sundays are Counted Time. Living life with God, however, can never be just boring and ordinary.



The truth is that there is a lot of Counted Time and people over the years have tried to find patterns or impose meanings on these Sundays. Modern ecological issues have driven some to turn the Green Sundays of September into the "Season of Creation", building on Harvest Festivals and the Ember Days.

The last Sunday of October was the original date of Christ the King and so some like to make the Green Time from then to modern Christ the King into the Season of the Kingdom. This is not so



arbitrary as the ecological Creation idea. Christ Himself told many stories which start "The Kingdom of heaven/God is like" Teaching about the Kingdom or Reign of God was fundamental to what the Saviour had to say to the crowds and to His closest friends. This very Sunday's gospel with the two brothers asking to sit at Christ's right and left when He comes in glory, shows that they believed He would come into His

glorious Kingdom in some earthly rather than heavenly sense. The story is in some sense directed to us, so that we learn to understand the true nature of Christ's kingship. The conversation as the Apostles came down Mount Thabor after the Transfiguration is another such moment. St Peter's slightly sticky moment after his confession of faith in the Christ at Caesaria Philippi is another.

The Passion and Cross are central to our Christianity, and they are to be understood in royal terms, but we need to keep working at our understanding of His kingship. The Cross is not to be glossed over or air-brushed out. It is not a conventional coronation like that of his majesty King Charles

or of the late Queen Elizabeth. If we try and turn in into mere theatre or a political agenda, we do the message damage and fail to honour Christ Himself. It does not belong to Left or Right but is held up for all to behold and wonder at.

The Institute of Christ the King, Sovereign Priest will keep their patronal festival next Sunday, but all of us are invited to observe the last few Sundays of Ordinary time with an eye to meditating on the kingship of Jacua Christ and on the nature of H



meditating on the kingship of Jesus Christ and on the nature of His kingdom.
